Trip Down the Rivers Canoe Trip

Journal of George "Jack" Hart

Transcribed by Corene Phillips

August 25, 1914, Tuesday

Billie Phillips and I going down the South Loup in a canoe, August 25, 1914. We are off at 2:30. Forgot our quilts. Had a nice trip to Poole. Arrived at 6:30. Went to see the deserted village. Couldn't buy what we wanted. Camped 2 miles east of the bridge, ate supper in the dark. Slept using the tent as quilts until 10 o'clock. Started to rain. Had to bunk under the canoe. Froze stiff.

August 26, 1914 a.m.

1:30 a.m. No sleep in sight, getting colder. One leg out in rain, soaked clear through. Br-r-r-r-r-r-! Crawled from under canoe at 5:30 a.m. Wood all wet. We try to pull down a dead tree. No success. Our fire is not going. Getting thawed, and boiling slumgullion.

Ready for South Ravenna. Broke camp at 8 o'clock.

August 26, 1914

Went under South Ravenna bridge at 9:00 o'clock. Struck Ravenna at 12 o'clock. We were chased by dogs but saved by putting a fence between us. We go in town and do a little shopping. Stop for

dinner 5 miles blow Ravenna at 2 o'clock. A little homesick at evenfall. Crawl in bed at 8 o'clock.

August 27, 1914

Slept fine got up at 6:30 and found breakfast ready (Bill must have made it.) Cloudy, raining and cold. Decided at first not to start but broke camp at 0 o'clock. Run out of Pleasanton water at Nantasket. Ate plums till there was something the matter with us. We called it nausea!! RAIN!! Struck Saint Michael at 12 o'clock. Took in the sights of the city and went back and ate dinner.

August 27, 1914

Saw Pleasanton train go by. Left St. Michael at 1 o'clock. Missed Boelus and was headed for Dannebrog. About 5 o'clock hit a sand bar where the South Loup flows into the Middle Loup. Camped 2 miles

August 28, 1914

Got up at 6:30 a.m. Slept fine. Foggy and misty crossed rail road tracks, cooked breakfast. Motor went by at 8:00 a.m. Now start down

river to Dannebrog. Arrived at 11 o'clock. We took in sights... a fine big town. Sent post cards. Ate dinner in city. Start for St. Paul at 2 o'clock. Nearly had an upset. But saved by head work. Arrived at St. Paul at 5 o'clock. First signs of traffic was a train crossing the bridge. Had supper then went to see the city. Went to a show. Slept in the

U.P. (Union Pacific) coach that goes to Pleasanton.

August 29, 1914

Pulled out of the coach at 3 o'clock and spent rest of night in tent. Drizzly, misty... tried to find straw for bed but no success. Went to town and watched out train pulling for Pleasanton and wished it was our time to go. Came back and got dinner. Went to matinee, bummed around. We sad Mr. Bishop. Went back for supper and went to show.

August 30, 1914

Church bell woke me up. Jack never slept a wink. Had jiggers. Cold as blazes and foggy. Took canteen and camera to get water and pictures. Had dinner in town. Saw a special train pull for Rockville to a ballgame.

Sat and slept around the depot till two girls came in and woke us up. Had a fine giggling match and talk.

Motor came in. Then went to camp for supper.

August 31, 1914

Took pictures of train crossing the bridge. Slept till 4 o'clock. Went up town and got dinner. I took insights of city.

Got drayman to get canoe and take it to the depot. Went back to camp. Got supper. Then to show.

September 1, 1914

Got up at 5:30. Cold again. Got breakfast at 6 o'clock. Pulled tent down, walked down the track to the depot. Looked like a couple

of bums. Stayed around depot till the motor came in. A freight pulled in from Ord. A motor came in from Loup City. Freight pulled in from Grand Island.

Our train switched and got ready to pull out. Stood around and watched them change freight and nearly froze.

Our train starts up. We crawl aboard. We are off for home. Rode in the box car with our canoe. Pulled into our home town at 11:30 am. Here we are once more running the streets (of Pleasanton).
