Funnel clouds were spotted between four and six pm on the evening of June 4, 1908. The single resulting tornado would end up causing thousands of dollars in damage to homes, barns, livestock, and other property.

Funnel clouds were spotted around five pm on the evening of May 29, 2008 approaching Kearney with what would be the most destructive storm in recent memory. It produced many tornadoes that caused extensive damage to homes and businesses in and around Kearney.

- -1 attended the May cultural director's breakfast and learned from Audrey about MONA's 100th anniversary plans. They are requesting BCHS's assistance with some research.
- -Mary Beth and I met with two potential Eagle Scouts and shared the list of project ideas. One gentleman is excited to tackle the brick laying under/around the train to reduce weeding and to allow for an extra path along the west and north side of the engine. He has already been out getting measurements. The other gentleman was going to see if his church had projects, too, and then get back to us.
